Benburb, Ireland

Alison Fitzgerald fell in love with willow more than 20 years ago when she came to live in Ireland.

"An understanding of the natural qualities of willow is a key feature of my work. My abstract wall designs express its lightness, flowing movement and pliability. I love the strong gentle curves of frame baskets which can be enhanced by the natural bark colours of the many varieties of willow, all locally grown."

Alison Fitzgerald came to live in Ireland at the Horticultural Research Station in Loughgall, Co. Armagh in the winter of 1980. The beauty of the willow beds there, with long, straight, brightly coloured stems inspired her to try weaving. The local tradition of basketmaking on the shores of Lough Neagh has also been a source of inspiration and knowledge. In 1985 she set up her own workshop, Greenwood Baskets. Since then her work has been sold and exhibited widely in Ireland, the UK, Europe and America.

Linen Basket

Thursday/Friday - 14 hr (2 days, 7 hrs/day)

A beautifully shaped form, Alison uses a modification of rib-rand that she calls "ripple weave" for the Linen Basket. There can be variations in the shape for this basket and an option of weaving a lid can be considered. This basket with its complex weave and challenging shape will be a good choice for the experienced willow weaver.

Approx. size: 24"H x 18" dia. (at widest point). Will vary according to shape woven.

Students Should Bring: Sharp knife, shears/pruners, bodkin (large awl), a square of leather or heavy denim, wrapping iron.

Cost: \$280 (class fee \$205, Material fee \$75)

Weaving Level: Intermediate to advanced experience



Boat Basket

Saturday/Sunday - 14 hr. (2 days, 7 hrs. /day)

From start to finish, all steps of this basket will be made in class. Making the hoop for the frame of the Boat Basket, learning the skill of splitting thick willow for ribs, being precise in shaping to achieve the lovely shape, "doubling up willow" for a interesting weave, and attaching a handle, are all skills that Alison will be sharing in this class.

Approx. size: 15 3/4"L x 11"W x4"H (8 1/2" H w handle)

Students Should Bring: Sharp knife, shears/pruners, bodkin (large awl), a square of leather or heavy

denim

Cost: \$265 (class fee \$205, Material fee \$60)

Weaving Level: Intermediate



Potato Basket

Monday/Tuesday - 14 hr. (2 days, 7hrs/day)

The Potato Basket is a pleasantly rounded basket, which uses some wonderful willow techniques that will add to your knowledge of rib style baskets. Making the frame hoop, splitting & shaving ribs, precise shaping and adding twisted rod handles will teach you how to create this wonderful classic basket.

Approx. size: 17 1/2"L x 15 3/4"W x 7" H

Students Should Bring: Sharp knife, shears/pruners, bodkin (large awl), a square of leather or heavy denim

Cost: \$265 (class fee \$205, Material fee \$60)

Weaving Level: Intermediate

Margaret Mathewson

Alsea, Oregon

Margaret Mathewson has been weaving since 1980. She studied Biology and Anthropology in college and has also studied basketry in California and the NW area with a number of traditional Native American teachers. She has a PhD from Berkeley focusing on contemporary trends in California Indian basketry and a Post doctorate from the Smithsonian studying early collections there. She works for Oregon State University as well as Western Tribes, museums and interpretive centers teaching ancestral skills, particularly basketry. She runs a retreat center and willow farm in western Oregon, Ancient Arts Center, teaching and hosting guest workshops. Learn more at http://www.ancientartscenter.com

Willow Coil

Thursday/Friday - 14 hr (2days, 7 hrs/day)

This is a traditional style from the California Sierra Nevada and Western Great Basin – one rod coil with split willow over round reed or a willow root. It will be as big as two days allows. Margaret will also demonstrate 2-rod coiling and pine pitch jars of the Southern Great Basin and show examples.

Students Should Bring: sharp knife, very small awl like a darning needle set into a handle, scissors, tin can or metal juice jar lid, towel

Cost: \$215 (Class fee \$175, Material fee \$40.00)

Weaving Level: Intermediate, dexterity is a good thing but beginners are fine.



Not-So-Big Burden Basket

Saturday/Sunday - 14 hr (2 days, 7 hr/day)

This is a twill twined cone shaped basket to carry your not-so-big burdens. Use skeined willow and redbud in a traditional Great Basin style with a complex or not so complex design. Material preparation will be discussed in class. Size -4-6 inches, will vary.

Students Should Bring: sharp knife, clippers or strong scissors, packing tool, small awl, tin can or metal juice jar lid, towel

Cost: \$235 (Class fee \$175, Material fee \$60)

Weaving Level: Intermediate – twining experience required



Swirl Medallion or Hair Pin

Monday/Tuesday - 14 hr (2 days, 7 hr/day)

Weave a twill-twined medallion or hairpin in several color combinations- using white willow and redbud, golden or black willow skeins. The pattern appears as spokes are added in a specific way. Two different borders will be covered in class along with material preparation. These are beautiful! Size – Will vary

Students Should Bring: sharp knife, clippers or strong scissors, packing tool, small awl, tin can or metal juice jar lid, towel

Cost: \$215 (Class fee \$175, Material fee \$40.00)

Weaving Level: Intermediate, twining experience required

Joanna Schanz

West Amana, Iowa

My willow adventure began with Philip Dickel, the last active willow basket maker of the Amana Colonies. He helped me to plant a cultured willow patch, taught me how to harvest and sort, and then, how to weave a traditional willow stake and strand basket of our German community. Since then I have had the opportunity to travel to such places as England & Germany and learn new techniques from other willow weavers, increasing my knowledge. Most of the time I weave traditional willow baskets – Phillip taught me that baskets are made to be used – so my creativity comes from weaving fancy bases, fancy French randings, and playing with the replaceable bottom foot. There are so many willow techniques to play with, that there seems to be no limit as to what can be woven.

Willow Harvest Basket

Saturday/Sunday – 14 hr (2 days, 7hrs/day)

This is a reproduction of an old willow basket from the Schanz family, used for harvesting the produce of the seasons. It has a wide bottom that tapers to a smaller top with one handle. Learn all the techniques used in the traditional German willow weaving of the Amana Colonies – twined and double twined base, four rod wale, French Randing, 2/2/2 border, replaceable bottom foot, and one twisted or cranked handle. A classic! Size: 12" H x 12"W (before handle) Sizes may vary.

Students Should Bring: Bodkin (large awl), sharp fixed blade knife, sharp pruners or basket shears, rapping iron, 12" ruler, paper & pencil for notes, old beach towel or sheet (wrap willow in)

Cost: \$222 (Class fee \$160, Material fee \$62.00)

Weaving Level: All levels
